ORDER

This case is before the Court on the <u>pro se</u> Plaintiff's Affidavit of Indigency, construed as an Application to Proceed In Forma Pauperis (Doc. 6). On August 3, 2018, the assigned United States Magistrate Judge issued a Report and Recommendation (Doc. 10) recommending that the Application be denied and the case be dismissed without prejudice. No party has filed an objection to the Report and Recommendation, and the time in which to do so has passed. <u>See</u> 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1); Fed. R. Civ. P. 72(b); M.D. Fla. R. 6.02(a).

The Court conducted a <u>de novo</u> review and will give Plaintiff a final opportunity to file a Third Amended Complaint. The Court has attached a form Complaint for Violation of Civil Rights and a Guide for Proceeding Without a Lawyer to assist Plaintiff in drafting the amended pleading. In doing so, Plaintiff should address the matters identified by the Magistrate Judge in the Report and Recommendation.

Accordingly, it is hereby

ORDERED:

- 1. The Court **DEFERS** ruling on Plaintiff's Affidavit of Indigency, construed as an Application to Proceed In Forma Pauperis. (Doc. 6).
 - 2. Plaintiff shall file a Third Amended Complaint by **October 5, 2018**.
