Before the Court is the parties' Joint Motion for Entry of Stipulated Injunction and Dismissal. (Doc. 56). The parties have reached a settlement in this matter. They propose the Court enter a stipulated injunction and an order dismissing the case under Fed. R. Civ. P. 41(a)(1)(A)(ii). (Doc. 56). But the parties condition the dismissal upon the Court reserving jurisdiction to enforce the terms of the parties' separate Confidential Settlement Agreement. (Doc. 56-1 at 11).

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The Court declines to retain jurisdiction over this case to enforce the

parties' Confidential Settlement Agreement. This does not leave the parties

without recourse—they may independently enforce their agreement in a

separate state court action. But since the parties conditioned their dismissal

on the retention of jurisdiction, the Court wishes to hear from the parties

before entering the requested injunction and order.

Accordingly, it is now

ORDERED:

The parties must tell the Court jointly in writing on or before January

20, 2023, how they would like to proceed given that the Court will not retain

jurisdiction to enforce their Confidential Settlement Agreement.
